Ceremony House Rules & Sanctuary Guidelines

To maintain a safe, sacred, and deeply supportive environment for everyone, we ask that all participants honour the following house rules. These guidelines ensure that the physical and energetic space remains a secure container for healing.

Mindfulness & Consideration for Others

Be considerate of the shared space: We are gathering in an intimate environment. Because senses are heightened during medicine work, our external interactions, sudden movements, or noises can deeply influence or disrupt another person's journey.

Respect every path: Every individual's journey, processing style, and personal beliefs are unique. We maintain a strict policy of ****zero judgment****. Honour your peers' experiences as you would want yours honoured.

Communication with Facilitators

Raise a hand for assistance: If you need to use the restroom, step outside for fresh air, or simply require emotional or physical support, please raise your hand. A facilitator will come over to assist you immediately. This helps maintain a calm flow in the room without disrupting others.

Keeping the Space Clean

No shoes inside: Please remove your footwear before entering the ceremony space. This keeps the environment physically clean and energetically grounded. (Cozy socks or slippers are highly encouraged!)

No smoking inside: The entire indoor sanctuary is a smoke-free zone.

Privacy, Security & Discretion

No photography or recording: To protect the vulnerability and privacy of everyone present, photos or videos of the ceremony space, the participants, or the approach to the property are strictly prohibited.

Keep the location discreet: We ask that you do not share the specific location details with anyone outside the container. Maintaining discretion ensures total privacy and protects the integrity of the event for future journeys.

Thank you for honouring these boundaries. By protecting the space, you are actively protecting your own journey and the journeys of those beside you.
